

IF YOU HAVE FOUND A CAT

If the cat will let you approach him, make a paper collar saying “If this is your cat please call this number

Fasten the collar with a SMALL piece of sellotape.

(sellotape around the whole thing could be dangerous if the cat gets caught in anything). If no one calls within 48 hours then the cat may be lost. Self adhesive paper collars can be obtained from the Cats Protection shop on Mill Road “The Cat Flap” or by contacting our Lost and Found Helpline **07889 976463**

If you have a secure cat carrier please take the cat to the nearest Vets where they will scan the cat (free of charge) to see if it has a microchip.

If the cat is hungry please feed it and provide water (not milk)

If possible provide some shelter ie access to a garage or shed or a cardboard box.

Give the cat’s description to the local vets in case the owner contacts them :-

Talk to anyone who makes deliveries in the local area. Ask if they know of anyone who has lost a cat or if they have seen any Missing Cat posters nearby.

Check the Lost & Found Pet section of the local paper. They will sometimes put free adverts in for one night.

Make up some notices saying “ Cat Found ” or these can be obtained from The Cats Protection Lost and Found Helpline **07889 976463**

These could be displayed at local shops, notice boards, schools etc.

If the owner can not be traced, and you can't look after the cat yourself, please contact your local rescue centre as above and ask them to take the cat in to care, and find it a new home.
