Coordinators report

Welcome to our Spring Newsletter and hopefully to better and brighter weather as the days are getting longer. It should also mean that my cats will be spending less time indoors spreading themselves across the backs of chairs and the tops of radiators and hopefully will be sunning themselves in the garden.

You will see from my report on our work with cats in 2019 that we had a great result from our neutering work which must make a difference to the lives of cats in our area. All this neutering work was completely funded by our branch as we didn't request a neutering grant from CP HQ last year and we haven't requested one this year either. We are very grateful indeed to all our supporters who donate money to us and to those who leave legacies in their will as this helps us to continue to fund this neutering work. We are currently running a "Snip & Chip" scheme in the Stowmarket area for the month of March and have nearly 80 cats registered so far.

From time to time we always have cats in care that have health or other issues that make them harder to home even though we will support them with the cost of medication etc. Fortunately for us and the cats the "right " home does come along eventually for which we are very grateful. This is particularly true for sweet Ruby– a lovely white & tortie girl who has a quite serous heart murmur so we thought she would be with us for some time. To our surprise a lovely lady came forward very quickly and Ruby is now a very much loved cat in her new home.

Cat Protection has recently introduced a free online course which is open to all called Understanding Cats' Needs – a guide to the basics of why cats do what they do! This course helps to understand the needs of your own cat living in your home as well as cats in the rescue environment and can make you think how you can make your home more cat friendly. Meet the Cats Protection team

Rebecca George is our PR officer. She runs our Facebook page, liaises with local media and occasionally contributes to discussions on BBC Radio Suffolk when the presenters are discussing cat-related topics. Rebecca is a member of the branch committee.

How did you get involved with Cats Protection?

Former branch coordinator Penny Alborough is a former colleague and 'encouraged' me to come along to a



committee meeting. Umpteen years on, here I still am. Our branch, under Margaret's sterling leadership, does great work so I am very happy to support it. We make such a difference to the unfortunate cats which end up in our care and to the wider cat community through our neutering work. It's well worth the investment of time.



What is the role of Social Media within the CP?

Our facebook page helps us to publicise our work to people (especially cat lovers) in our catchment area. I post several times a week – perhaps a new cat we're looking to rehome, a missing cat, news of an event or initiative, or general cat care advice. It's a successful page with lots of followers and lots of engagement. From time to time it has helped us to find one of our cats a new home too!





Where does your love of cats come from?

I had cats as a child so they were my 'first love' but I love all animals and have had ex-battery chickens, guinea pigs and other pets over the years. I currently have two 15 year old tabby brothers, Archie and Max. We got them as kittens

when my twin daughters were about 8 years old and we'd just moved to Suffolk from London. My daughters have since grown up and moved out but the cats are still going strong and loving life.

I work full-time but usually from home so they have plenty of company and regularly gate-crash my skype calls. About six years ago, we took on a rescue Labrador, Bramble, and, once they got over the shock, the cats took this in their stride and all three have learned to co-exist – on the proviso that Bramble knows that the cats are in charge.



What is the most challenging aspect of your work?

I don't find anything particularly challenging. It can be a little disheartening when it takes a very long time to find a cat a home – or when people don't understand the way we work or that we are all volunteers. The majority of people we deal with are considerate though and grateful for our help - and the feeling of joy and relief when one of our cats, particularly our long-stay cats, goes off to a wonderful new home, makes it all worthwhile.

We're a busy branch juggling the rising costs of looking after the cats in our care – veterinary bills, food, litter and other equipment – with our efforts to help the cat population locally. We do this by offering financial support with neutering to those who need it and by neutering cats in feral colonies.

While we are all volunteers and put a huge amount of our own time into caring for and rehoming unwanted or abandoned cats, running our branch is expensive and we have to raise all of the funds we need ourselves. To give you an idea, the total cost of caring for our cats in 2018, including our neutering work, was around £16,000 and this excludes our running costs. With a diminishing band of volunteers, we are unable to run as many fundraising events as we used to so we are increasingly looking for other ways to raise funds.

One simple way you can help us is to leave us a gift in your will. It is a wonderful way to ensure that you continue to help cats after your death and leave a legacy to be proud of.

We are grateful to have been the beneficiaries of several legacies over the last few years and they have made a huge difference to the level of support we have been able to offer. We always try to send a personal thank you to each donor but we have been advised not to publish a list of our kind benefactors due to Data Protection Legislation.

Making a will is the best way to make sure that your wishes will be respected, that your family and friends are taken care of and that any gifts you wish to leave are clearly understood. 
