

Home-to-Home – H2H (formerly known as Direct Homing)

Since we had the go-ahead from Head Office that we could resume our Hometo-Home adoption service, we have been kept rather busy. So far we have helped to re-home eight cats and sort out temporary fostering for a further four.

For those of you not familiar with this process, H2H is really beneficial for a small branch like ours,

where pen space is at a premium. The cat does not come into our care but remains in their own environment with their owner whilst we put the word out that they are looking for a new loving home (with doting slaves of course). Then we put anyone interested in touch with the owner and it is entirely the owner's decision as to whom adopts their cat. It works a bit like a dating service! Obviously, for very urgent or emergency situations H2H is not an option, but in cases where timescales are not super-tight it can work well and is less stressful and

disruptive for the cat. Social media platforms are key in this process. We have a H2H page on our website where cats' details are uploaded, and we post on Facebook. Instagram and Twitter too. Interestingly. there doesn't seem to be a magic formula as

to what type, age, colour of cat makes a good candidate for H2H. Younger, healthier cats are usually quicker to re-home but we have had success with some more 'Senior Kitizens' too. A background story and a cute photo always helps! As with any re-homing, H2H is a real team effort and many thanks to everyone involved.
