This month we shall be promoting the benefits of rehoming a mature cat.

Older cats still have so much to offer. They can be homely and extremely generous in their affections, and just want a comfortable, safe, loving home in which to enjoy life.

Sadly, these qualities are often overlooked and older cats can become long-term residents in our care.

Across the UK more than six times as many kittens are being adopted instead of their more elderly friends.

Across the charity, very young cats often only remain in care for up to 10 days in comparison to older cats who are left behind for up to 59 days.

Improvements in cat care have greatly raised the quality and life expectancy for cats across the UK and many household moggies are now living into their late teens and early 20s in good health.

Adopting an older cat has many benefits that people often overlook:

- older cats tend to stay closer to home so make great companions,
- their characters are fully formed so you know what to expect,
- they are generally less demanding than younger cats, and
- they are less likely to scale the curtains or knock your ornaments off the shelf!

This is Lily, a gorgeous 14-year-old girl.

She is a mature and gentile lady who deserves a quiet and loving environment to spend her twilight years but, at her



age, we are worried for her prospects of finding a new home.

Lily would make a great companion for a mature person who won't see her age as an issue, as she doesn't ask for much. A warm spot on a comfy sofa or a sunny spot in the garden is all she needs.

Lily could do with a few home comforts and a few tasty treats to build up her strength. If you're looking for an easy going and loving feline friend, then please consider an older cat like Lily, don't write them off, they need and deserve a home too.

You can be confident that our vets have given all our cats a thorough health check, so you will have an up-to-date record of their health from the moment you choose to adopt them.

Also, our cats all come with four weeks free pet insurance with PetPlan, which is guaranteed to continue regardless of your cat's age, if you so wish. Many other insurance companies do not insure older cats, which is why we chose PetPlan as our partner.

When you take out insurance after the initial four weeks, you will receive another four weeks free, plus the Adoption Centre will benefit from a percentage each time you renew your policy. So in some small way you are still continuing to help the charity and the cats in our care.

So please, don't walk past an older cat. They have a lot of love still to share.

Neutering

We do not have too many kittens in at the Centre at the moment, but kitten season will soon be upon us, which is why we really recommend neutering your cat. Here is some useful advice:
