## Wills

REMEMBER A CHARITY IN YOUR WILL Help the work live on...

11<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> September 2017 is Remember A Charity in your Will Week, an annual awareness week designed to encourage more people to take a moment to consider leaving a gift to charity when writing a Will. Cats Protection is a member, alongside over 140 of the UK's favorite charities. We work together to encourage people, once they've looked after their family and friends, to leaving a gift to charity. 74% of people in the UK support charities in their lifetime but only 6% leave a legacy in their will.

Gifts in wills are vital to us and account for more than 50% of our income, so without this we would literally be half the charity we are today!

#### **Cat Guardians**

Cat Guardians is a service we offer to ensure that your cat(s) are looked after when you pass away. As soon as we are notified of your passing we will arrange to bring your cat(s) into our care, where our dedicated volunteers and staff would care for them, as we would for any cat that needs our help. We would then look after your cat(s) while we try to find them a loving new home that matches their personality and needs. We never put a healthy cat to sleep so we will care for your much loved cat for as long as it takes to find them a new home.

The Cat Guardians service is free of charge. However, many people who register also choose to leave us a gift in their will, as a way of saying thank you for promising to make arrangements for the care of their feline friend.

## Is your Cat a Hunter?

While hunting is a natural behaviour for cats it can create a tricky conundrum for cat owners who love wildlife.

While it may not be possible to stop your cat from hunting, there are things that you can do to help reduce it:

- Keep your cat in at night
- Provide your cat with a puzzle feeder/ball
- Play with your cat more to stimulate them

A cats motivation to hunt is not linked to hunger, it is a natural instinct and endorphins are released when they catch prey or a toy which makes them feel good.
