Hello,

I hope you had a lovely Christmas and I wish you a very happy new year.

There are many people I would like to thank who work tirelessly behind the scenes to raise money, getting donations into our branch, and working in so many ways to support CP.

For example, Ali is our Neutering Officer but she has also taken on the task of claiming gift aid. This was a mammoth job, and dated back to 2010. Ali has done incredibly well and has nearly completed right up to 2016, with the following amounts:

2010 = £2738 2011-2013 = £4396 2014 = £2888 2015-16 estimated at £3000.

Then there is Amanda, she is a home visitor/emergency fosterer or whatever we throw at her. She also works tirelessly getting donations for the cats in our care. She has regular donations set up with zooplus, viovet and ocado, saving us a fortune in food, specially prescription food, litter and accessories. She doesn't stop there, as there is sometimes so much food, not just cat, she shares it with other charities including dog charities and small animal charities. This has created a community bond between the charities and we help each other.

Jackie is Fosterer, home visitor, lost, found, H2H (Home to Home) coordinator and my right arm. Jackie works tirelessly trying to re unite lost cats with their owners, from the initial call with advice and help. She contacts her list on a weekly basis for updates and support. She keeps in touch with all the owners on H2H to make sure of any changes or change of plans and to update them of any interest. She also keeps the records of all cat movements within the branch, from their coming into us, their health and their adoption. Anything thrown at Jackie she just gets on with it, always with the best interest of the cat as priority!

We are still temporary closed to new incoming cats, but I am hoping we will soon be able to change this.

In 2016 we homed 115 cats from our care and 16 Home to Home cats. These are cats that are able to stay with their owner and we find them suitable homes.

You may remember in the previous newsletter the story of Squishy who came into our care as a tiny kitten who had been taken away from her mum far too early and then suffered neurological injuries. She gave us quite a scare at the beginning of December. She was unwell with a viral infection that required oral antibiotics. Unfortunately the combination of antibiotics and illness required a stay at the vets and a very intense enema. It was a very tough weekend and wasn't looking good but this little fighter turned it around again. She is now doing very well but still needs a lot of attention to make sure she eats correctly and is kept as healthy as possible.

Thank you to everyone who made donations via the Justgiving page or in other ways, the target was to raise £800 towards the cost of her treatment, and I am thrilled to report that the response so far has reached over 73%.

Our Ebay expert Caroline does a fantastic job of selling donated items on behalf of the Branch – Thank you Caroline.

She said this years Ebay total is £2,493.27 (up by about £400 on last year). Not everyone will appreciate but I try and list about 5 items **every** day. (I don't always manage this!). Naturally not all of these sell and some will do better than others. However it boils down to the fact that I'm always on the lookout for items to list **all year round**. I then photograph them all and hopefully post at least half of them. If you can help increase sales by donating more items then please, I would love to have them. Any that do not sell are returned to the 'pot' ready to be tried at the next event.

Any unwanted gifts, good clothes, shoes, jewellery, craft items, handbags - you name it I will try it. I do not know what will do well - it all depends on who wants what we have on offer.

In order to keep costs to a minimum I also appreciate any bubble wrap, tissue paper, wrapping paper, polylopes and larger sized jiffy bags, small to medium boxes or other packing materials. Even sellotape/ brown parcel tape is most welcome (You can imagine I have to buy this on a regular basis!)

Items that did well this year were: a pair of bright orange Doc Martens, Ted Baker clothes, Thiery Mugler perfume, cashmere sweaters, several leather jackets, Prince's LP - Purple (sold just after he died), craft items (wool / material), Welsh Blanket, handmade Mustang boots, musical box, special jigsaw and a sheepskin jacket. I even sold some parrot roller skates for £10!! Who knew parrots loved roller skates?? (Whatever next!!)

Thank you to everyone who already donates items/packing materials - I couldn't do it without you.

#### **Other Fundraising**

If you have any toys or gifts to spare please contact Sallie , she has 4 market stalls booked for Berkhamsted next year (see dates in what's on) and will need goodies to sell and helpers to collect donations in March April June and September, If you are willing to help (subject to confirmation of dates) please let Sallie know, don't wait to be asked!

We always need things to sell at the jumbles, clothes in particular but most items will bring in some much needed funds. We usually do well at jumble sales and we are happy to receive clothes, bric a brac, puzzles, toys, games, ornaments and other items but, **please, they must be clean, complete, unbroken, and usable,** even for a jumble, or we can't sell it and it is not nice having to dispose of somebody else's rubbish.

We have been given notice by CP NCC (National Cat Centre) that there will be F2F (face-to-face fundraisers) operating in Hemel Hempstead Marlowe's outside Tesco between 13-19<sup>th</sup> Feb and 8-14<sup>th</sup> May. Some people do not like being approached in this way and may assume that our branch is responsible but we are not. They may also assume that they are supporting the local CP branch rather than NCC. We hope there will be more positive than negative reactions and we are told by NCC that it is has been proven as the best way of recruiting donors and that branches can benefit from these activities, ie:

Giving monthly via Direct Debit, has proved to be the single most reliable source of long term, sustainable funds for most UK charities.

Although the activity will be paid for by NCC, a one off payment of £15 will be given to the branch for each donor recruited in that branch's area for Cat Sponsorship, £10 for Weekly Lottery.

Fundraisers where possible will try and leave a flyer with people who don't sign up asking them to support their local branch

The long term funds from face-to-face will help our work with cats

Face-to-face fundraising should enhance branch fundraising efforts.

Alongside the money per donor mentioned above, the activity will raise awareness of the charity in the local area and this can make other fundraising approaches by the branch more successful.

We work with several professional fundraising organisations, and the costs vary depending on the terms that we have managed to secure with each, but somewhere between £70 and £120 per donor recruited is normal. It typically takes more than a year for a donor's payments to exceed the fee that we have paid for their recruitment. Once that 'break even' has been achieved, of course, all further donations can be used for our work with cats. It's the long term nature of the donor's support that makes this type of fundraising so successful and this is why it is used by so many charities.

If you are receiving this newsletter via email and wish to know more there is an extract FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) attached with this mailing but it is too long to reproduce in the newsletter.

Star is about 2-3 years old, we are unsure of her past as she was left in a carrier at our vets. She will need a home with an experienced cat owner, who is willing to give her lots of time and patience. Star is a very pretty girl with a lovely purr, and very chatty with it!. Although she loves rubbing herself round your legs, she is not keen on too much fuss, but we think this will change in time. We hope to find a home for her with a couple or a single person (not with children), where she is the only pet and will have access to a garden once she has had time to settle in. He is a lovely cat and would make someone a great companion, but would do best as the only pet. . He would love a garden to explore after his settling in period.
