Welcome to our Spring Newsletter, how lovely to see daffodils everywhere and new green shoots. What a shame the Easter weather was a bit chilly but let's hope for some warm sunshine soon.

We have a number of black or black and white cats waiting for new homes, so if you are able to offer a home to a cat please spare a thought for them. They are just as loving and individual as cats of any other colour but are often overlooked. If you've never owned a cat before and are concerned about your lack of experience we will be happy to give you as much advice and support as you need. After all, our primary aim is to match cats with people, and if you need help you'll find that we have lots of experience that we'll gladly pass on.

It is the kitten season again and prospective kitten owners should be aware that cats start breeding earlier than you might think possible (and it won't matter to them if it is with their sibling!) so neutering is essential. Contact our neutering help line on 01442 251536 if you'd like to find out about financial assistance towards neutering your kitten. You can also visit our Facebook page or website. Don't forget to have the cat microchipped too – if your cat gets lost for whatever reason it gives you a much better chance of getting it back.

In 2015 132 cats were re-homed and we helped a further 12 cats to be homed directly from the owners, and 300 neutering vouchers were issued.

Destiny is approximately 10 months old and was found in a poor state after being involved in a road traffic accident. She sustained fractures to her pelvis. With loads of TLC and 8 weeks of cage rest she has recovered very well. She is a very friendly little girl and has started to learn how to play again. She has also learnt not to be ignored, she will tap you to remind you she is here. Once she has your attention she is like putty in your hand and will show her appreciation. A beautiful little girl that so deserves a second chance of a loving home.

Dennis, an 11yr old handsome black cat who came into rescue due to incompatibility with the family dog. He can be a little aggressive until he knows you well but loves his grub, so is very bribe-able! Dennis will require a home with no young children, no other pets and preferably with a seasoned, experienced lion tamer (only kidding)!!

Guinness is a stocky black and white boy approximately 7 years old. He would be best suited to a quite home with no young children but gets on well with other cats. He loves a fuss but will let you know when he has had enough, loves to lie on his back and relax all day. Sometimes he likes to have a chat with you and will let you know if his hungry.

First there was **Mojo**, who has been in care for a while. He became very close to his human foster mum but he needed a diversion. Hello **Tessa**, she came in after being trapped between two walls and caught in netting, she has made a complete recovery. They were neighbours in care and started to show an interest in each other so we decided to see how they would react to each other over a weekend. Well, Tessa pinched his bed but as the gentleman he is, Mojo used hers. Then she pinched his food, and got away with it. Next day they were sharing both a bed and food! Short haired Mojo is approx 8/10 years old while semi longhaired Tessa is only 11 months old. They are now inseparable and so good for each other. You have to see them to see how beautiful they are together.

Two more cats needing a home together are **Snoopy and Minnie**. Snoopy is a long haired black cat, approx. 7/8 years of age and due to a road accident he lost his back leg but he gets around just as well on three legs. Minnie, a light tabby, is a little older approx. 10 years of age. Snoopy is very outgoing and loves fuss and being with people he also loves being brushed. Minnie loves people and will come up and greet you with kisses but they get their confidence from each other and need to be together in their new home, ideally in a mature family environment

Consider the Lilies

There is a heart-breaking story in the Spring edition of The Cat about a beautiful kitten which died as a result of ingesting plant material from a bouquet of flowers which had been placed on a table. If you are going out to get plants for your garden, or if you bring cut flowers into the house do remember that all parts of lilies are toxic for cats. They may try to chew the leaves or brush past the plant and get pollen on their fur which they lick off. If you suspect your cat has been poisoned it is important to take it to a vet immediately.

And a warning from Suze not to ignore apparently trivial symptoms in your cat, as they can indicate something more serious. Our Mia had just a slightly runny eye and occasionally she sneezed, but she did not seem unwell. However tests showed she had an aggressive cancer of her jaw. The nature of her problem was such that taking her any earlier wouldn't have made any difference, but in some cases it might.
