


Feline behaviour – visual guides

Why does my cat...?



Have you ever wondered why your cat does certain things? Here's our guide to a few common behaviours.




1. Spraying

Male or female cats may spray, whether neutered or not. There are lots of motives for spraying including sexual reasons, stress (if indoors) or normal scent marking (if outside).

4. Slow blink

Slow blinking. If a cat slowly closes their eyes and reopens
