## Minimum Veterinary Standards (MVS)

Vet check	<ul><li>Who?</li><li>Every cat in Cats Protection's care</li></ul>	<ul> <li>When?</li> <li>ASAP after entry into care</li> <li>If cat becomes unwell/ behaviour change</li> <li>Rechecks for ongoing condition</li> <li>Recheck every 3 months if still in care</li> </ul>	Remember  Not fit to home until condition resolved or stabilised  Protocols and procedures available on website  Contact the Cats Protection veterinary department for: difficult cases, outbreaks, spending over £500	
Microchip	Who?  • All cats not already chipped	<ul> <li>When?</li> <li>Before homing</li> <li>Kittens chipped by twelve wee of age or sooner</li> <li>Implanted by a vet as part of clinical exam or operation</li> <li>Chip registered to owner at position</li> </ul>	<ul><li>after coming into care</li><li>Chipped strays can't be rehomed for 28 days</li></ul>	
Vaccinate	Who?  • All cats not fully vaccinated (FHV, FCV, FPV, FeLV) but not pregnant queens  • For lactating cats, discuss with vet	<ul> <li>When?</li> <li>ASAP after coming into care</li> <li>From eight weeks of age</li> <li>At least 48hrs before neutering procedure</li> <li>Not within 48hrs of rehoming</li> </ul>	Remember  Two-vaccine course with matching brands  Refer to our vaccination FAQ's at cats.org.uk/help-and-advice/information-for-vets	
Neuter	who?  • All cats must be neutered before homing (kittens may be homed with a neutering voucher)	<ul> <li>When?</li> <li>Kitten neutering from two day after first vaccine</li> <li>Pregnant cats neutered if vet a</li> <li>Lactating cats neutered if vet a</li> <li>Strays: neuter after day 7 unlegeneral anaesthetic for urgent</li> </ul>	grees grees  grees bond delay homing of kittens as they can be homed with a neuter voucher if necessary	
Parasite treatment	<ul> <li>Who?</li> <li>All adult cats and kittens over six weeks of age (including pregnant and lactating queens)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>When?</li> <li>After first vet check</li> <li>Within one month of homing</li> <li>Repeated at appropriate intervals while still in Cats Protection care</li> </ul>	Check Cats Protection's 'routine parasite control procedures' document available at cats.org.uk/help-and-advice/information-for-vets	
	Who? • Test all higher	<ul><li>When?</li><li>ASAP after coming into care</li></ul>
