

Fostering for Cats Protection

"When you become a fosterer for Cats Protection you temporarily become a mum or dad for the cat you are asked to care for. Your duties towards the cat involve feeding, cleaning, and playing, as well as giving them love and care, administering medication and preparing them for their new home. It is also important to realise you will get a variety of different cats, with different personalities and some of them may even have disabilities due to accidents or certain medical conditions that you will need to pay attention to. There are times that you will need to help a cat regain its confidence and faith in humans.

I was fully prepared by the team at Cats Protection for what I might face when I became a fosterer and whilst you may sometimes find it overwhelming you are continually well supported. As you continue to care for your foster cat you can witness it change from a shy and scared car to one that is happy and confident. You can say to yourself 'I did that. I brought a cat or kitten out of its shell and restored its faith in humans. I helped a cat find confidence again.'

I have enjoyed my time as a fosterer. You will sometimes feel sad when the time comes for the cat to be re-homed, but you have experienced things that the new owners will not have seen. You will have seen the cat transform into a better version of itself and prepared them for their new home to the best of your ability and for that you will be deeply touched."
