## Volunteer shop 'bookworm'

Our retail 'bookworms' help raise the funds needed for us to help cats and kittens in need – whether they have a passion for books, cats or both! They identify and price saleable books from donated stock and the money raised goes directly to helping our feline friends. Making a difference can mean raising as little as 18p, which is enough to feed a cat in our care for a day.

- Sorting and pricing books
- Creating eye-catching displays
- Free text as bullet points
