Making a better life for cats

Cats Protection is the UK's largest cat welfare charity. Since we were founded in 1927, Cats Protection has rehomed over 2 million cats and kittens and championed the rights of cats.

Our vision is a society where every cat has their best possible life because they are protected, cared for and understood by everyone.

This is not an easy thing to achieve, but that's the point. It's challenging and ambitious, just like the event you've signed up to tackle! Together, we can work towards our purpose: to help people see the world through cats' eyes.

Meet Peach...

Abandoned in a cat carrier in Reading, Peach and her six tiny kittens arrived in Cats Protection care in a desperate state. Barely six weeks old, they were underweight, suffering from cat flu, and had runny eyes that needed immediate attention. The team at Cats Protection quickly stepped in with eye drops and antibiotics and supplemented them with kitten milk.

Thanks to the tireless efforts of our team, Peach and her kittens began to thrive. It wasn't long before they found their forever homes!

From the start, it was clear that Peach and her kitten Lychee shared an unbreakable bond, always following each other around. We knew they had to be rehomed together, and soon they found a loving family to take them both.

Without the continued generosity of supporters like you, our cat centres wouldn't be able to be here for cats like Peach and her kittens. Thank you for taking on this challenge for the cats and kittens in our care!



Your impact. Stronger when doing it for cats!

Just by signing up and raising vital donations, you'll be helping to make a better life for cats, because life is better with cats.

- £10 could fund four packs of catnip mouse toys for cats in Cats Protection care
- £50 could provide a cat in need with a full first veterinary exam, vaccination and a flea and worming treatment





- £150 could feed 25 cats in Cats Protection care for 30 days
- £300 could cover the full cost of neutering for three cats
- £500 can cover the cost of nearly 150 bags of cat litter
- £1,000 could cover the cost of major dental work, including tooth extractions for two cats
- £2,000 could cover the cost of six Hide & Sleep®, providing places for cats to hide, sleep and get up high

Hitting your goal. Easier when doing it for cats!

Check out our top tips to leap towards your fundraising goal!

1. Personalise your page



Scan the QR code or go to justgiving.com/cats

to set up a JustGiving page, so that your supporters can easily donate to your cause. Adding a profile photo,

a story about why you're supporting Cats Protection, and posting regular updates helps people feel like they're making a difference to you and your cause.

2. Self-donate

If you can, make the first donation to your online page. The larger this is, the better, as this acts as a benchmark and encourages others to follow in your footsteps. People who self-donate raise 42% more!

3. Spread the word!

Share the link to your fundraising page on your social media, WhatsApp groups, and via email to friends, family and colleagues. Don't be afraid to remind people to sponsor you if you think they've forgotten! It's a good idea to share again around payday when people are feeling more able to give.

4. Saying thank you

Take the time to thank your sponsors individually on your page and on social media. They'll appreciate it, and it will inspire others to support your cause. 20% of donations come in after your event has finished, so make sure to follow up to thank your supporters at the end of your challenge too. We can provide real examples of how your donations have helped the cats in our care to update your sponsors on their impact!

5. Offline fundraising

Don't forget, you can always go old school and download our sponsor form to raise some cash. We have a variety of fundraising materials that you can use to raise donations in person, such as collection buckets,



bunting and t-shirts.

6. Matched funding

Ask your workplace if they will match your sponsorship or donate towards your total. Many employers offer matched funding or one-off donations towards charity events. They may even offer to allow you to fundraise at your place of work.

A walk for Sausage and Nemo

Vicky and her husband Adam were inspired to sign up for the Glasgow Kiltwalk by their two ginger rescue boys, Sausage and Nemo. "Cats always tend to be forgotten about. People think cats can just fend for themselves, but these little creatures need just as much love, care and attention as any animal," Vicky explained. "I'm just happy I can fundraise to help support the very

important work you do. I had a bake sale at the office, which raised over £100. That was a great day! Altogether, we've raised over £400."

Vicky's best advice for anyone training for a walking challenge? "If you are wanting to do a long walk, wear good shoes, thick socks and pack blister plasters."



Getting creative. Better when doing it for cats!

Reaching your target doesn't just have to be asking friends and family to donate. Organise a fundraising event to help you hit your goal, have fun, and even learn new skills in the process! We have lots of great resources to help you host the perfect fundraiser, from quiz questions to branded invitations, poster templates to bake sale cake labels! Visit cats.org.uk/eventresources to explore resources available.

- Quiz night. By far our most popular fundraising idea to help reach your target. We've even put together some cat-themed questions to help bring people even closer to the cause
- Sweepstake. Taking on a running or step challenge? Get people to make a donation to guess your time or mileage for some lighthearted competition
- Raffles. Organise a raffle where participants buy tickets for a chance to win donated prizes. This can be done in person or online. Ensure you check out the Codes of Fundraising Practice guidelines or get in touch for more details around gambling laws when hosting a raffle <u>fundraisingregulator.org.uk/</u> guidance/topics/lotteries-and-raffles
- Bake sales. A classic! The way to people's pockets is through their stomach. Why not make it cat themed, with a competition for the best cat likeness in cake form? Download our cake labels so that everyone knows what cakes are up for grabs



- Paint and sip event. Host a paint and sip night where participants pay to join a painting class and enjoy wine or other beverages. Provide materials and charge for tickets
- Bingo night. Number four, scratch at the door! Organise a bingo night with cat-themed calls and prizes. Charge for bingo cards and offer additional games or raffles
- Clothes swap and sale. Gather together all the clothes that you no longer wear and take part in a clothes swap. Ask for donations to attend or pop prices on the clothes to sell. Alternatively, sell clothes on a platform such as Vinted or eBay

When you're organising a fundraising event, it's important to abide by the Codes of Practice issued by the Fundraising Regulator to help keep everything safe and legal.


Make a difference for moggies like Magpie


