

ONE IN THREE REQUESTS WE GET TO TAKE CATS IN RELATES TO HOUSING PROBLEMS

We contributed to a wider Cats Protection survey on the extent to which housing problems - properties not allowing pets, people going into care, people moving and abandoning cats, etc - were behind requests to us to take cats in.

It may not be more generally applicable, but over recent months our figures show that about one-third fall into this category.

Let's hope Cats Protection and other animal charities can work on this massive problem of hostility by landlords and freeholders to pets as valid members of the family.

If only he could talk! Charlie's story is a long-running one and a bit confused, but he was living rough when the people who seemed to be his owners washed their hands of him.

He's coming round slowly, although he is still quite nervous, but we hope to be able to persuade him soon that he wants to go to see the nice Vet Man or Lady to have some needles stuck in him!

..... AND WORK IN PROGRESS

We also have some interesting cases in hand:

- A Persian (Iranian) cat whose owners no longer want her back after an enforced four month quarantine arising from deficient import documentation.
- Abandoned/stray kittens, some only a few days old (all now reserved), including four dumped at Kew Vets.
- Ben a cat who was left at a vets in Buckhurst Hill when his owner could not afford the bills
 he's had to have his eye removed and is recovering in Peter's care.
- Marley an RTA victim, assumed to be a stray, with complex but not life-threatening injuries which have been operated on by Bishop's Stortford Vet Hospital. He will need cage rest with us for a few weeks before finding his new home.
- Cats, some in poor condition, from a couple of evictions in Harlow. We are working with the Housing Department and The Scratching Post rescue on these, and two of the cats, Smudge and Poppy, are already at Lissa's getting medical attention and a lot of well deserved TLC.
